Message from Our Rabbi

Planting and Harvesting

Here it is June and now the "dry heat" begins. Everything we experience until the High Holidays in September is not about the heat but about the continuity of life's journey. It seems that we count time by the holidays which includes the change of seasons. For me, it seems that the calendar

flies by from one holiday to the next. Additionally I see the plants start to bloom, the trees regain their blossoms, and the earth come alive after sleeping all winter.

Our lives also concentrate on planting and harvesting. When we start out we plant the seeds of our future by our actions and deeds. The growth that occurs is determined by the fertilizer we use and the water needed to assist in the development of that which has been planted.

Just what is the fertilizer? It consists of traditions and customs. It contains environment and habits that are learned from these exposures. As we get older we discard some and develop others. That is part of growth. As with that which is planted, it too accepts the environment that surrounds it, discarding some foliage and growing replacements. Life imitates nature as nature imitates human life, inseparably.

What is the water that sustains us? For vegetation it is rain. For us it is the water of knowledge and the benefits of exchange of ideas. It is allowing our minds to expand to absorb all that is around us, such as the plants do as they drink up the flow from springs and rivers.

Perhaps this is a circuitous way of explaining my thoughts for this time of the year – time for relaxation, time for slowing down, time for planning, and time for thoughts about our congregation.

We are a viable institution of learning and praying. We are also a collection of philanthropic and social individuals committed to the continuity of our heritage and faith. This happened because many dedicated people saw the need, answered the call and began a process that has changed with time. It is a living place with living emotions, living needs, living wants and desires. And, we all share the pains that come with time: the loss of a loved one and the joy of celebrations. Through it all we see each other as we are, not as we think we should be.

We pitch in when needed and step back when it seems appropriate. We laugh, we cry, we interfere sometimes, we listen to things that really are insignificant. When we come together as a congregation we understand that we are one with each other because we cannot do without each other, even those we may not be so fond of.

All of us make sacrifices in different ways. For example, when our congregation needs stability we look for those with experience to teach us how to learn from the past to ensure the future. When our congregation has financial needs because of demographics which either take people away or find members distancing themselves because of ailments, we should be willing to come forward and help. Synagogues go through cycles as we do – we nurture (plant seeds), we feed (bring life to our experiences), we gather (harvest) our resources to give us the nourishment needed for our future. We are planting seeds, we are watering that which we are planting and we will harvest a crop that will be fulfilling to ourselves, our congregation, and most of all to God.

Be safe this summer. Come back to a stronger and more secure congregation. My prayer is that the upcoming High Holidays will find us more in tune with each other so that our mission to bring a fruitful Jewish experience to the Southeast Valley and beyond will find success.

Why Do We Do the Things We Do?

Many times I am asked about certain traditions and customs that are followed – or not. Some of these observances carry with them both history and law. Over the millennia many have become part of our lives, and even though we may not follow them, they still contain remembrances of childhood memories that included parents and grandparents.

Perhaps it would be beneficial to learn about them in order to obtain a more reasonable appreciation, especially during the High Holiday season fast approaching:

For example:

- 1. Kever Avot a tradition of remembering our friends and family who no longer share the celebration of life with us. This service of remembrance occurs on the Sunday between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Even though we recite the Yizkor prayer on Yom Kippur, still this act of recalling those whom we miss, is the forerunner to the Yom Kippur service as a form of reminding us that there is never enough time to express our gratitude to God for their lives that impacted ours. This year, again, we will hold this 30-40 minute service at the Valley of the Sun Cemetery at 10:30am on Sunday, September 16th, preceded by a social half-hour at 10:00am.
- 2. Tashlich The act of casting away our sins is traditionally on the first day of Rosh Hashanah (our service day) and takes place at a body of water containing live fish. Why do we follow this custom why do we cast our sins upon the water where live fish swim? Glad you asked. First, we cast our sins upon the water as described in Scripture (Micah 7:19). This is an ancient ceremony of renewal the symbolic throwing of our transgressions to the wind. Second, we cast these crumbs where live fish swim so that they can eat them thereby ensuring that our sins are gone forever. We will revive this custom immediately following the service on Rosh Hashanah at approximately noon at the lake immediately behind the Chapel (near the apartments).
- 3. Round Challah instead of the traditional braided challah we bake challah that winds upward. This is to remind us of our rising to a higher level in our quest for connection to God. The High Holidays are designed to remind us that our acts of contrition are sincere, thus bringer us closer to God.
- 4. Birchat Kohanim the traditional blessings from the Kohanim dates back to Temple times. The High Priest would enter the Holy of Holies to beseech God on behalf of the people. He was not an intermediary, but rather an emissary of the people. The Talmud tells us that the High Priest would then utter the name of God and seek forgiveness for all. Only the High Priest was allowed to enter the Holy of Holies once a year and only on Yom Kippur. We have initiated this tradition a few years ago with the hope that its significance will resonate with us.

If you have any other recollections of High Holiday traditions and would like them explained, please feel free to let me know. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are times set aside to consider the past with an eye toward the future. It is a time for family and friends – a time to celebrate life.

The Synagogue will be filled with everyone looking for the friendship that is the hallmark of our congregation. The warmth that brings closeness to us all will radiate our experience. The fellowship found with renewal of relationships will remind us that we are here, together looking for continued meaning.

All these things and more are what make the High Holidays so special. We look forward to greeting each of you as we begin a New Year filled with all the joy life can bring.

In the September, the Shpiel marking the beginning of a new year in the life of our congregation, will feature more inspirational information to enhance the holiday experience.

Remember to Remember

Too many times we are involved in mourning the loss of a loved one. Sometimes the pain is so unbearable that we try to forget. However, to forget is to eliminate one ingredient in the formula for immortality – memory.

We light candles each year to commemorate a life. Four times a year we recite the Yizkor prayers to celebrate a life. Each action involves remembering someone who has had an impact on our lives and remains a blessing to us.

Not everyone can or will have a monument erected to sustain the memory of those who have gone before us. However, each of us has the opportunity to erect a plaque on the Memorial Board in the lobby of our Chapel. These names will remain in perpetuity and are a constant reminder of the affection and fond memories we carry with us throughout our lives.

At Yizkor services on Yom Kippur we will re-dedicate our Memorial Boards. There is one to remember those members who were instrumental in our continuity and survival as a congregation, and there is another to remind us of the legacy we inherited from friends and relatives.

Also, at Yizkor services we will dedicate all the new plaques erected on the non-member Memorial Board the past five months. And, we will honor the memory of the members of our congregation who no longer are part of our journey by calling out their names in appreciation for their service to our survival as an institution of faith and connection.

I urge all to consider honoring a loved one by having a plaque erected prior to the High Holidays. May all their memories remain with us as we enshrine them on our **WALL OF MEMORIES**.

Jewish Programming on DirecTV

Channel 388 on DirecTV is the Jewish Broadcasting Service (JBS), which presents a wide range of Jewish entertainment and education throughout the day. For example, a complete musical Shabbat Service is broadcast Fridays at 3PM from the Central Synagogue in New York City, and news from Israel is broadcast daily at 3PM, except for Friday when it is 2PM. During Chanukah, there were multiple special music programs like the award-winning "a cappella" group Maccabeats. Check it out.

Cantorial Notes: God Is with Me

In June it is traditional for us to have a healing service. In Hebrew we say "Adonai Li" for God is with me. I will open the healing part of the service with this song because of the text's ability to give us comfort during *difficult* times. The complete text of this song comes from part of the Adon Olam as follows:

The Eternal is with me, I will not fear. Into Your hands I entrust my spirit, when I sleep And when I wake, and with my spirit my body also; The Eternal is with me, I will not fear.

The prophets regarded healing to be both physical and spiritual.

That is why most of our prayers for healing include body, mind and spirit in the appeal to God for healing. However, this is not to say that Jews rely solely on prayers for healing. Not only do we support "Scientific medicine," Rabbis used to forbid Jews from living in cities without a physician. In bringing this to your attention I hope to raise your awareness that synagogue prayer lifts the spirit which can feed and support physical healing with the help of competent medical professionals to address healing of the body.

The statement that God is with us is seen throughout the Torah (i.e. Gen 21:22 God is with you [Abraham] in all that you do"). We are to take comfort that we are not alone, and that God provides strength and comfort. Healing is a layered process in which the spiritual cannot be taken for granted. When we address the mind and spirit, we build support for the body.

JERUSALEM (Reuters) - Intel Corp said on Tuesday it had submitted plans to expand its production operations in Israel, with the government saying the U.S. chipmaker would invest about \$5 billion between 2018-2020, and had agreed to spend 3 billion shekels on local suppliers. "According to company officials, this investment is expected to pave the way for a future significant investment for a technological upgrade at the Israeli site," the ministry said in a statement.

Intel is one of the biggest employers and exporters in Israel, where many of its new technologies are developed. The new investment will upgrade its Kiryat Gat manufacturing plant in southern Israel.
