

#### **Something You Might Not Know – Sam Steiger** (from Murray Siegel)

Who was Sam Steiger and why should I care? Most *Shpiel* readers were probably not living in Arizona in 1976 and do not understand the significance of Sam Steiger. Sam was born in New York City and did not lead a typical New Yorker's life. He was a tank platoon leader in the Korean War and received the Purple Heart and Silver Star medals. The purple heart is awarded if one is wounded and the silver star recognizes gallantry in the face of the enemy. It is the third highest U.S. military award. He received his B.S from Colorado A&M. Sam moved to northwest Arizona – he had attended a dude ranch in the state when he was 14 and decided that he wanted to live here.

Sam got involved in politics and served two terms in the State Senate and five terms in the U.S. House of Representatives. He had a very conservative voting record; the liberal ADA (Americans for Democratic Action) gave him a zero rating! In 1976, he decided to run for the open U.S. Senate seat created when Republican Paul Fannin retired. Sam's opponent in the contentious Republican primary was John Conlan, who asked, if folks here wanted "...a Jew from New York telling Arizona what to do?" Sam won the primary but many of Conlan's supporters voted for the Democrat, Dennis DeConcini, who was the last Democrat to represent Arizona in the Senate.

Later, Sam was elected Mayor of Prescott and served one term. In 2002, he suffered a stroke, eventually passing on in 2012. The 2018 Senate race participants might reflect back on 1976, where a nasty primary fight cost the Republicans a seat. Would it have made a difference if Sam Steiger was not Jewish? What do you think?


