# Message from our Clergy



#### Haman is alive and well!

Yes, Haman is alive and well and still in Persia (Iran). His sons are also doing well (the Mulahs). And the destruction of the Jews is still at the top of the list. Purim is almost here and we are faced with the same tragic events that gave us the celebration of this holiday. History is repeating itself even after 2500 years. It is like being brought back in time. The place is the same, the players the same, the intention the same. Will the results be the same? Where is Esther when you need her? Where is Mordecai?

I am reminded of Psalm 83: "O God, keep not your silence; hold not your peace, and be not still, O God. For lo, your enemies are in an uproar; and they that hate you have lifted up their head. They hold crafty converse against your people and, take counsel against your treasured ones. They have said: 'Come, and let us cut them off from being a nation; that the name of Israel may be no more in remembrance." On and on the Psalmist decries the tortuous torment of the Jewish people.

You would think that this was written today because the prophesy is being fulfilled. Have you read the venom pouring from the mouths of the Iranians and their so-called religious leaders? It is as though they were copying their threats directly from the text. Do you remember Pittsburgh? The hate and vitriol resonates, in this country, today more than in recent memory.

I am also reminded of an essay written by Pastor Neimoller during World War II: "First they came for the Communists, and I didn't speak up because I wasn't a Communist. Then they came for the Jews, and I didn't speak up because I wasn't a Jew. Then they came for the Catholics, and I didn't speak up because I was Protestant. Then they came for me, and by that time there was no one left to speak up for me."

And what of God's silence? Isaiah answered that question most eloquently: "For as the Heavens are higher than the Earth, so are My ways higher than your ways and My thoughts higher than your thoughts." The answer to God's silence is our silence and inaction. God is not silent-we are deaf. Faith does not require an understanding, but rather our participation in what was ordained from the beginning: To live together, to work together, to be strong together, to act together. Maybe then we can eliminate the evil that confronts us.

And perhaps as Psalm 83 ends, we too will understand: "That they may know that it is You alone whose name is the Lord, The Most High over all the Earth."

Haman may be alive and well, but his fate is written in sacred texts.

It is my prayer that this Purim we will begin to witness the redemption of our people, and Israel will be safe and secure because the world will finally realize that if Israel falls all of us will not be far behind.

Like most grandchildren, they were kind of spoiled by each Nana and Papa and always played lots of Sorry, Casino, War, or whatever the game du jour happened to be.

So it was with delightful anticipation in late March that Jim and I attended our daughter's first grade open house, when each child had been asked to write a story about their favorite holiday. We wondered how Karen would choose between Purim and Pesach. Her teacher, Miss Debbie, had informed all the parents that the stories would be posted around the classroom. We asked Karen what she decided to write about, but she kept a very earnest look on her face and answered that she and her best friend from across the street, Sarah Fitzpatrick, had promised to keep everything a secret. They wanted their stories to be a surprise.

And a surprise it was! We arrived at Thayer School and wandered around her classroom, looking for her story. During our search, we read stories written by many of Karen's classmates, all very cute little two or three sentence tales. Finally we found Karen's. It was titled, "Why I Love St. Patrick's Day."

Of course, Jim and I both started to laugh. Sarah's family made a big green deal around St. Patrick's Day, and Karen always loved to participate. But then we found Sarah's story. Hers was all about Queen Esther. At age six, these two happy little girls had unknowingly educated one another about the fun aspects of their heritage. They loved each other's customs and didn't blink an eye about knowing and accepting that the other's home was different. Life was so uncomplicated. Oh, to be six again!
