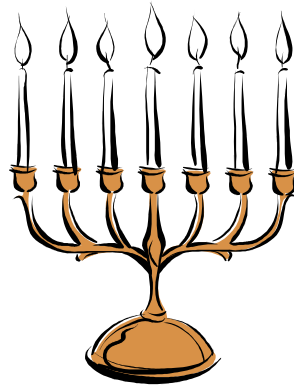

The Impact We Have on Others

While it is true that, as hard as we try, we will never abate hunger, or eradicate poverty, or even eliminate homelessness, we do know that one person helping another will eventually begin a process that will relieve these afflictions. So it is with us in a place called Sun Lakes Jewish Congregation. We may not be hungry, or homeless, or impoverished, but we are in search of fulfillment.

This fulfillment comes in many forms. There are those who find completion by coming together in worship, some by celebrating holidays with family and friends, some by extending a hand to ensure continuity – the continuity of faith through involvement. Not everyone comes forward, but those who do offer so much that can never be repaid in kind.

Dear God, You endowed us with both eyes and ears. Teach us to use those eyes to see the horrors before us. Teach us to use our ears to listen to the cries of the generations sent to all corners of the Earth to fight for justice and decency. Give us the ability to access the teachings You sent through the Holy words of Scripture: there will come a time when the lion will lie down with the lamb, and each will live under his fig tree and not be afraid.

Perhaps then, O Lord we will earn the blessings You bestow upon us each and every day.

Jewish Programming on DirecTV

Channel 388 on DirecTV is the Jewish Broadcasting Service (JBS), which presents a wide range of Jewish entertainment and education throughout the day. For example, a complete musical Shabbat Service is broadcast Fridays at 3PM from the Central Synagogue in New York City, and news from Israel is broadcast daily at 3PM, except for Friday when it is 2PM. Something You Might Not Know – A Jewish U.S. President (from Murray Siegel)


Will there ever be a President of the United States who is Jewish? Many Americans doubt that will ever happen, yet some scholars believe that there already has been a president who was actually Jewish. John and Mary Huffman, a German Jewish couple, immigrated to the U.S. and landed in Maryland. They moved to Kentucky and, finally, the family settled in Texas. Their daughter, Ruth, was Jewish since both of her parents were Jewish. Ruth married a non-Jew and had a daughter, Rebecca Baines, who, as the daughter of a Jewish mother, was Jewish.

Rebecca married Sam Johnson, and their son was Jewish, even if he did not know it. His middle name is his mother's maiden name, and we know him as Lyndon Baines Johnson. LBJ, although Jewish by birth, did not consider himself a Jew and worshipped at a Disciples of Christ Church. LBJ had an affinity for Jews and went out of his way to assist Jews.

When Lyndon was a boy, his father and grandfather worked to seek clemency for Leo Frank, a Jew who was eventually lynched by the Klan in Georgia. The local KKK threatened to kill the Johnsons because of their support for Frank. As a member of Congress before World War II, LBJ helped hundreds of refugee Jews immigrate to the U.S. through Texas. Some of those immigrations were of questionable legality, since there were restrictions on immigration. In 1938, Johnson was responsible for saving the life of Erich Leinsdorf, an Austrian Jew who was a renowned musician. Johnson arranged for Leinsdorf to receive a difficult-to-obtain U.S. residency permit.

LBJ generally had a positive view of Israel. His Aunt Jessie was a member of the Zionist Organization of America and strongly influenced young Lyndon. After JFK was assassinated, LBJ told the Israeli government that they had lost a friend, but now they had a better friend. Most importantly, he supplied needed arms to Israel after the Six Day War, when France froze their deliveries of armaments to Israel. Lyndon Johnson may not have been Jewish in his religious practices but he would certainly have been considered as a Jew in Nazi Germany and he acted with great simpatico towards Jews and Israel.
