Hanukkah 5784

Each year we all agonize over whether Hanukkah is a religious holiday. Many interfaith households wrestle with the situations of respect and sensitivity to Hanukkah and Christmas. And every year there are articles written about how to celebrate and how to identify, so that the spiritual aspect is not lost in the commercialism.

It certainly is a time of lights. There is darkness all around us. The days are short. The nights are long. It is cold and the harshness of winter is fast approaching. Life withers as do trees, and flowers, and people. We sleep, as does nature. Some do not wake. It is the darkest time of the year.

This particular year it is very dark. Gloom and doom seem to be everywhere. We are witnessing mass murders occurring in our cities. In Israel the nightmare of barbarism remains evident with the murder of 1400 Israelis. The description of these atrocities is too gruesome to describe. And the destruction of the evil that has permeated this corner of the world hopefully will be eliminated. Is there a light at the end of the tunnel? We have such doubts, and we struggle to find optimism.

Hanukkah is a time of re- dedication — we saw an example of that when the Maccabees put sword in hand to ensure the survival of the lewish people and

their faith. We cannot recapture the past, but we can use it to ensure the future. The religious freedom that was won some twenty-three hundred years ago has been the clarion call for all people throughout history. Every battle for religious freedom has had as its foundation the spark from the candles lit to celebrate the scourge of evil.

Hanukkah helps us understand the eternal struggle of good over evil. We pray for good to survive. We attempt to eradicate evil. What we all want is to be left alone so that we can be secure and free. What we need are voices that will drown out the hate and animosity. God cannot do this for us — we need to do it for ourselves. That is the message of Hanukkah — with faith in the right, we lead the battle — not expecting some mighty hand to do it for us. We have been given the ability to survive. All we need to do is grab it and run with it.

And yet, in the final analysis, we still want some Divine intervention to save us from the path of destruction whether in the Middle East or here at home. And to pray for guidance is not bad; it is necessary for us to understand that it is we who must affect the change for good to complete the partnership we all have with God.

Hanukkah is also a time of spiritual connection to our beliefs and to togetherness. Hanukkah, to me, indicates the need to set aside petty jealousies and indignations and concentrate on peace and goodwill among people and nations.

Hopefully the lights of this season will remind us to respond to those in trouble so that we can be an instrument in relieving all the pain and suffering. Perhaps the lights will begin a tomorrow that can be better as it emphasizes that life is cherished above all else. We should all pray that the leaders of our country, The United States of America, receive Divine guidance to ensure that we remain a beacon of light and influence to all people.

Above all, we pray that the destructive forces alive in every part of the world, in particular in the Middle East, will be relegated to memory so that we can all enjoy the birth of a new era in the history of humanity.

Please join us at our Erev Shabbat service on December 8 at 7:00 pm, the second night of Hanukkah. We will light our Hanukkah menorah, graciously donated by Gail Dante in memory of her husband and our long-time member, Jack.

LONE SOLDIERS THANK SUN LAKES JEWISH CONGREGATION

SLJC and the Community responded graciously to the current Israeli crisis and war. Your generous donations allowed us to raise \$6,000 in emergency donations for our three Lone Soldier Center partners in Israel. The needs of Lone Soldiers have dramatically escalated because of the unimaginable, horrific terrorist murders by Hamas on October 7. Although they are well prepared and trained for combat and combat support roles, Lone Soldiers as well as the rest of the IDF and reservists will be in harm's way for an extended time. The ongoing battle and responses to Israel's attempts to maintain security will reverberate for some time.

Black Shabbat, as it is now known, was a tragedy that has affected Jews across the world in ways that we may not have imagined. All of us were aware of rising antisemitism in the US, Europe and Great Britian, but I'm not sure that we expected Israel and Jewish hatred to be so widespread, intense and vicious.

Again, a happy Hanukkah to you and your families, and let us all pray for peace on earth for the coming year.



UNITY IN ISRAEL

I am writing this, 32 days after of the horrific massacre of Jews in Israel on October 7, 2023. Black Shabbat, as it will be known, occurred in the context of the most social and political divide that Israel has known in its 75-year history. Suddenly, there was an immediate unity response because 1400 Jews were killed, 240 taken hostage and thousands injured. The survival of Israel was threatened.

No reservist stayed home as threatened. Virtually everyone who was not called into the IDF as a reservist is doing their job or volunteering to support the families of those killed, injured or kidnapped. Identifying those murdered and seeing that they have an appropriate Jewish burial has been challenging. Vast communication networks have identified needs, allowing Israelis to respond.

One area of unity has been remarkable. Service in the IDF by ultraorthodox, especially the Haredi sect, has been a major divisive issue among Israelis for decades. Young Haredi men who decided to join the IDF were often considered to be Lone Soldiers because they were no longer welcome in the family home. The Supreme Court has postponed deciding about mandatory draft since 2012. In fact, the current right-wing conservative government pushed for judicial reforms, in part because they want to court to rule that Haredi IDF service would be mandatory.

However, since October 7, over 3000 Haredi men have indicated a desire to join to IDF in non-combat roles. Before entering Gaza, many IDF soldiers wanted to wear tzitzit under their uniforms. Haredi rabbis are mass producing these to meet this demand.

Hopefully when the military engagement concludes, Hamas will be eliminated and Israel will regain security. This unity will be sustained with the understanding that the mutual needs of all Israelis far exceed their differences.

TAX CREDIT DONATIONS TO THE EAST VALLEY JCC BENEFITS SLJC

What is it? The Arizona Charitable Tax Credit is for people who have made a Tax Credit donation during the tax year to a Qualifying Charitable Organization such as the East Valley JCC (EVJCC).

What Does This Mean for You? Donating to EVICC will receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit on your Arizona state income tax return. This means that you can SUBTRACT your donation amount from the taxes you owe.

Can I Receive Multiple Tax Credits? Yes. You can participate in all the AZ tax credit programs and receive a separate tax credit for each donation you make.

How Much Will I Receive? You can receive a charitable tax credit of up to \$421 if you are a single taxpayer. Couples filing jointly can receive up to \$841 credit on their Arizona State income tax return. It is a direct dollarfor-dollar credit back to you.

Special Offer for Members of Sun Lakes Jewish Congregation. For every tax credit donation to the East Valley ICC Qualified Charitable Organization, the Sun Lakes lewish Congregation will receive an incentive grant equal to 18%.



SOMETHING YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

MAKING JEWISH BASEBALL HISTORY By Murray Siegel

May 5, 2023, was a historical night for Jewish baseball fans as the Baltimore Orioles visited the Atlanta Braves. What was significant about this game was that the starting pitchers, Dean Kremer for Baltimore and Max Fried for Atlanta, are both Jewish. The last time a Major League game was played where both starting pitchers were Jewish happened 57 years ago, on September 25, 1966, when Sandy Koufax faced Ken Holtzman (Dodgers vs. Cubs).

Fried is the son of Jewish parents, grew up in Santa Monica, CA, and by age of seven, he knew he loved baseball. He learned to throw a curveball from Reggie Smith, the retired outfielder, and pitched for the USA baseball team in the 2009 Maccabiah Games, in Israel, where the team won the Gold Medal. At Montclair Prep, Fried wore #32 to honor Sandy Koufax.



Kremer is also from CA and had his bar mitzvah in Israel. He holds dual Israeli-American citizenship — his parents are both Israeli — and the family speaks Hebrew at home. He started his baseball "career" at the age of five and won a baseball scholarship to UNLV, where he starred.


