# RABBI IRWIN WIENER, D.D.



#### "What the world needs now!"

Fifty years ago, a song was introduced that became an instant hit. It's title: "What the World Needs Now." It caught on for several reasons, but I believe, the words ring true today, more than ever. All we need do is turn on our TVs

and witness the madness that surrounds us. No longer is it necessary for the media to create sensationalism to create a following. We are the characters in an ongoing epic of melodrama and mayhem.

Read the words, listen to the melody, and you will find the accurate cry of the generations past and the hope, as well as the despair, of today.

"What the world needs now is love, sweet love, It's the only thing that there's just too little of. What the world needs now is love, sweet love. No, not just for some but for everyone."

Imagine the lament of a parent who witnesses the senseless death of a child caught in the quagmire of hate. Hear the cry of people taken from their homes and indiscriminately slaughtered because their beliefs differ from their murderers. Watch the planes drop bombs on cities and dwellings, causing panic and displacement. Witness the world pontificating about issues that are so far removed from reality.

Today, more than ever, we sit in our comfortable homes and stare at pictures of atrocities only read about a generation ago. The glamour of conflict has disappeared and has been replaced by the actuality of the gory details. Extremism has replaced common decency. We no longer think in terms of "Peace on Earth, good will toward men." This has become a momentary slogan followed the next day by sameness.

Do we ever stop to think about the abundance of goodness that surrounds us? Have we really considered that the more fortunate need to be concerned about those with less? Why do we concentrate on helping others at certain seasons of the year, and then forget them the other days?

Look around and we can see the beauty that was created for us to enjoy. God did not cause all this to be part of our enjoyment of life, only to watch its destruction. We were given gifts for unimaginable fulfillment, and we seem to enjoy squandering them rather than participating in these treasures.

Is one life worth more than the other? Do some deserve to live, and others die to satisfy the living? There is enough mercy and justice for all, not just a few. Look around, if you dare. What do you see?

Our fields are now strewn with bodies. Our meadows are soaked with the blood of the innocent. The lights of heaven are clouded with the smoke of bombs and cannons. The rainbow, which was set to remind us of God's compassion, has added a black stream in mourning for civilization's ability to destroy rather than perpetuate. We ask God to listen to our cry, but we are the ones who are not hearing the sounds of bitterness and anguish.

During the most heinous period in human history (World War II), the question was asked, "Where was God?" And the answer given, "Where was man?" Where are we? Where are we going? We have forgotten that "What the world needs now is love, sweet love. It's the only thing that's there just too little of... No, not just for some, but for everyone."

#### LONE SOLDIER PROJECT

#### THE MICHAEL LEVIN MEMORIAL LONE SOLDIER CENTER

The Lone Soldier Project partners with three Lone Soldier centers in Israel. Your donations enable the project to provide the resources for their services. The Levin Center is the largest of the three. Our donations are primarily used to fund Shabbat and holiday meals. Here is a summary of some of their 2023 services:

- 15,600 Shabbat and holidays meals
- 2,500 hours of individualized emotional support
- 175 Lone Soldiers housed in 7 facilities
- 1.250 essential needs for new Lone Soldiers
- 300 new olim soldiers
- 1,250 celebrated holiday parties
- 1,627 calls to the hotline (from Lone Soldiers and parents)

After October 7, the project made an emergency donation of \$3,000 to this center which supported:

- 200 equipment sets to support combat soldiers
- 5,000 personal items in the field
- 50 financial assistances to reservists called to active duty
- Established a 24/7 emotional support system for soldiers during wartime, providing counseling and assistance
- Provided ongoing updates and support to Lone Soldiers' parents, ensuring constant information and assistance

#### SOMETHING YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

#### **ALAN ARKIN** By Murray Siegel

In June of this past year, Alan Arkin passed away from heart disease. He had a history of coronary problems. He was born in Brooklyn, NY with grandparents who had immigrated from Russia, Ukraine, and Germany. Alan was raised in a Jewish household without any emphasis on religion. His family moved to Los Angeles when Alan was 11.

Most folks know that Alan was an Academy Award winning comedic actor, but something you might not know is that he had a major hit record. In 1956, he was part of a singing group called The Tarriers, which took advantage of the craze for Calypso music. Reworking the lyrics of "Day-O" sung by Harry Belafonte, the group produced "The Banana Boat Song" which reached number four on the Billboard chart. They followed this with "Cindy, Oh Cindy," which was a hit in 1957.

Alan started his acting career with Second City and moved to Broadway. He came to the attention of most



Americans as the Russian naval officer in the 1966 movie "The Russians Are Coming, the Russians Are Coming." In 2007, he received the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor for his role in "Little Miss Sunshine." His son, Adam Arkin, is a professional actor as well.


#### Literary Ladies Book Group

#### JWV SPEAKER PROVIDES TRANSPORTATION FOR NEEDY VETERANS' FAMILIES

Jewish War Veterans Copper State Post 619 (JWV) is proud to welcome Bryan Chaplin, Founder of Bravo Brotherhood Veterans Foundation, as its featured speaker Sunday, February 18. The meeting takes place in the Poolside Building at Oakwood Country Club.A "Meet & Greet" with FREE lox and bagels, coffee, and doughnuts begins at 9:30 am with the speaker following at 10 am. All are welcome.

The Bravo Brotherhood Veterans Foundation, a 501(c)3 organization, was established in Feb 2019 by Bryan and Michelle Chaplin. Bryan served in the US Army from 1985-2005 before enlisting in the US Air Force from 2005-2015.

The Chaplins felt a strong desire to assist veterans needing a "hand up" in life. They recognized that a lack of transportation and avoiding homelessness contributed to the huge gap in the kinds of services provided. Bravo Brotherhood's primary role is repairing and donating vehicles to veterans with families so they can get to work, school, doctor appointments, etc. To date, the Foundation has provided 20 vehicles to disadvantaged veterans and their families with more to come.

Some vehicles that are donated come to them after other veterans have seen the impact that providing reliable transportation can make. Additional vehicle donations have been referred by the great people from Voluntary Services at the PHX VA, and one was donated by Sanderson Ford. On occasion, the parts and services have been donated by other generous local dealerships.

The Bravo Brotherhood Veterans Foundation has been funded and staffed largely by the Chaplins and from generous volunteers and companies. Every donated vehicle requires repairs, and Bryan does most of this work himself at his home in Surprise. When the repairs are not within his capabilities, he reaches out to a few friends (skilled mechanics) who are able and willing to provide support.

Obviously, Bryan could use more volunteers with mechanical skills and financial donations and, of course, more cars. There are several motorcycle associations



and organizations, such as lewish War Veterans, that help support Bravo Brotherhood financially with their generous donations. To donate time, money, and/or mechanical skills, contact Bryan Chaplin at (602) 930-6374, bravobrotherhood@gmail.com.

According to Bryan "Chappy" Chaplin, "We have all had our problems in life. But if there is one glimmer of hope for our veterans, we want to be part of it! Our veterans have provided the umbrella of freedom that we all live under, and we should never forget the sacrifice they have made for us."

JWV Post 619, which meets the third Sunday of each month from September to May, boasts members who represent a wide range of religious affiliations and participates in philanthropic activities to help veterans of all faiths. 




#### TAX CREDIT DONATIONS TO THE EAST VALLEY JCC BENEFITS SLJC

What is it? The Arizona Charitable Tax Credit is for people who have made a Tax Credit donation during the tax year to a Qualifying Charitable Organization such as the East Valley JCC (EVJCC).

What Does This Mean for You? Donating to EVICC will receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit on your Arizona state income tax return. This means that you can SUBTRACT your donation amount from the taxes you owe.

Can I Receive Multiple Tax Credits? Yes. You can participate in all the AZ tax credit programs and receive a separate tax credit for each donation you make.

How Much Will I Receive? You can receive a charitable tax credit of up to \$421 if you are a single taxpayer. Couples filing jointly can receive up to \$841 credit on their Arizona State income tax return. It is a direct dollarfor-dollar credit back to you.
