

New Team Members In the New Year



Wow! It's already 2020. I hope you have a wonderful year, filled with good health, peace, and an openness to change. The Board of Directors, as well, is adopting new ways of doing things that will affect all of us, hopefully in good ways.

To start with, I am delighted to announce that Wendy Feldman-Kerr has rejoined the board

after a few years' absence and has agreed to become co-president. Wendy was previously a vice president of the BOD and knows the operations and practices very well. In addition, through her work on the Budget Committee and professionally as a Financial Advisor, she has knowledge of business and non-profit needs and finances, which will be of great assistance.

At the November BOD meeting, we thoroughly discussed our current challenges. Primarily, we are a community of many retirees and we face an aging congregation. There are fewer and fewer individuals who want to accept major volunteer responsibilities. To an extent, this is understandable, although the situation still has to be remedied. I am happy to say that Marilyn Koss, just elected to the BOD at the annual meeting this past November, has agreed to become Membership Chair. You will be hearing more from her as the year goes on. When Michael Dar, who had acted both as Treasurer and publisher of The Shpiel, decided to step down, the BOD faced two major areas to fill. We owe Michael many thanks for making such a commitment to SLJC.

After much thoughtful conversation and after noting that qualified congregants who were asked had declined, the BOD voted to outsource both the finance and publishing responsibilities. Simply put, we cannot provide appropriate services to our members if we don't ensure expected and necessary monthly operations, reporting, and communications. For the accounting and finance duties, the BOD has voted to hire Lesley Cochran, an experienced bookkeeper, for a three-month trial period.

The BOD has also been very fortunate to have identified and hired Liz Vaisben, owner of evdesignport, to publish The Shpiel. Liz is the publisher of several other temple publications and is quite flexible to be sure each client receives the type of publication desired. Mike Milgroom (who will be our official BOD liaison for The Shpiel) and I met with her to discuss how our monthly articles will be passed along and edited; we'll make tweaks as needed so that The Shpiel will come to us each month as usual. You may notice a few design changes and more photos; Liz jumped in right away to produce this edition of The Shpiel that you are now reading.

These decisions by the BOD will no doubt bring about some questions, and I encourage you to call me (480-305-0123) or email me (gerijim@hotmail.com) if you want to talk. Thank you to everyone who has volunteered in the past and to those who continue to do so. In the long run, SLIC will continue to be a strong and vibrant congregation for us all.





LONE SOLDIER PROJECT by Michael Cohen, MD

Thanks to all the congregants who wrote Hanukkah Greeting Letters to Lone Soldier. Many people preferred writing notes on generic "Happy Hanukkah" cards over the "Happy Hanukkah" stationary. Next year, there will be cards available to everyone.

SLJC letters were part of a larger effort during which we spoke to 560 youth at 7 congregational religious schools, two day schools, two summer camps and a preschool. Other community organizations contributed letters to bring the total to over 700 letters that were sent to three Lone Soldier Centers in Israel.

Committee members who have participated in our Youth Education presentations have found them both enjoyable and meaningful. Souzan

Blumberg noted: "As I looked around the classroom that day, I realized this educational activity involved all generations. We seniors were teaching and inspiring children, teen counselors, and parents... and our caring letters would connect the Arizona Jews to Jews in Israel." The 2020 Hanukkah Greeting campaign will be expanded and we will need more volunteers. If you have an interest in interacting with youth of all ages, let us know at lonesoldiers@evjcc.org.




