Another year!

It seems that time escapes us no matter how we try to hold on to it. It is as though we blink and then we travel to another time and place. Was it yesterday when we were young and full of life? Perhaps it was a moment ago when we were accomplishing things unreachable today.

Regardless, here we are entering 2023. Hopefully it will be a year filled with many accomplishments and fulfillments.

There are several new years in the Jewish calendar because there are times and events that shape our lives that require celebration. In fact, each time we enter a new period of joy, we utter the words of the “Shehechaynu” prayer which reminds us of our good fortune in attaining another milestone in our lives.

Of course, we are all aware of Rosh Hashanah — the new year of reconciliation. And there is Passover — the new year of religious identity. Perhaps there are those who remember Tu B'Shevat — the new year dedicated to nature and ecology symbolized by our appreciation of trees. In modern times this is commemorated by planting trees in Israel through the efforts of the Jewish National Fund.

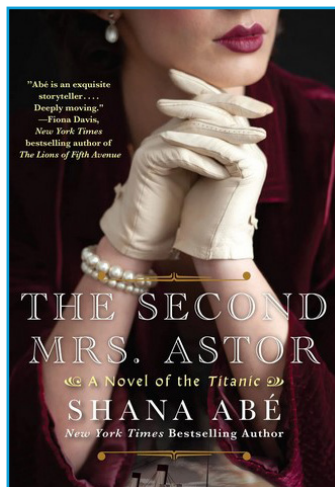

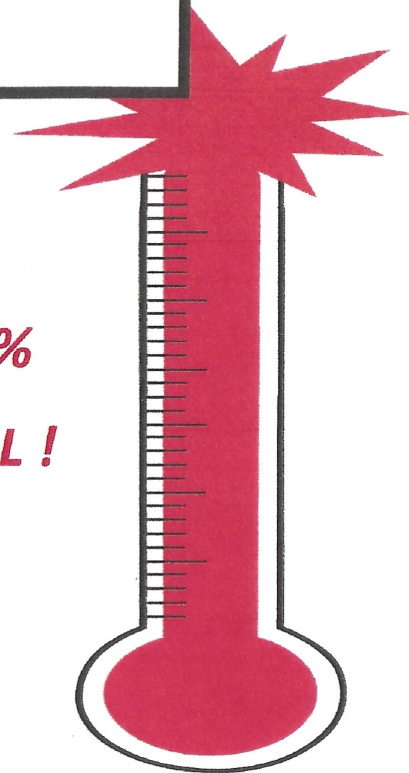

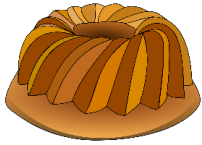

SLJC CONGREGANTS JOIN 1,000 ARIZONIANS REACHING OUT TO LONE SOLDIERS FOR HANUKKAH

The 5th annual Hanukkah Greetings Campaign expanded to Tucson and Prescott this year, with a total of approximately 30 sites, including nine synagogue religious schools, four day schools, seven youth programs, and ten adult organizations. SLJC members composed letters in person at group meetings as well as electronically. Outreach is ongoing to other Arizona communities within organized Jewish communities. An online inquiry even led to participation by a religious school in Manchester, Connecticut.

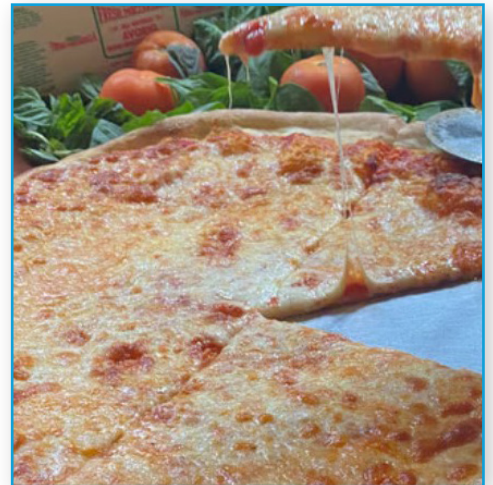


SLJC MEN'S CLUB

SOMETHING YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

TOMAS STRAUSSLER

Every once in a while, you hear of a famous person who was born Jewish but left the faith, only to reconsider being Jewish at a much later date. Such a person was born Tomas Straussler to a Jewish family in Czechoslovakia in 1937. His parents were not observant, but as Jews they were in danger when Germany took over the country. His father's employer arranged for the family to be transferred to Singapore.

When the Japanese invaded Singapore, Straussler's father joined the British Army and moved the family to India. The father was killed by the Japanese, but in 1945, his mother married Englishman Kenneth Stoppard, who adopted Tomas and his brother. Tomas became Tom Stoppard, a world-renowned playwright and screenwriter. Among the honors awarded to Tom are the PEN Pinter Prize and being elected an Honorary Fellow of the British Academy. He won an Academy Award and a Golden Globe for writing *Shakespeare in Love* and has four Tony Awards to his credit.

Late in life, Tom learned that all four of his Jewish grandparents were murdered in Nazi concentration



camps. His newest play, *Leopoldstadt*, relates the experiences of a Jewish family in Vienna, Austria, as the Germans took over. The play opened on Broadway on October 2 to rave reviews and has already been awarded the Laurence Olivier Award for the Best New Play.
