Message from Our Rabbi

Passover, 5776 Passover, 5776

A New Month – a New Year – that's what Passover is: The celebration of newness. Passover is one of the New Years we celebrate; there is Rosh Hashanah, the beginning of our personal introspection; there is Tu B'Shevat,

the beginning of spring and the re-birth of plant life and vegetation; there is Passover, the beginning of our understanding of freedom and the value of life.

And this is a time to remember the past as we commemorate Yom Hashoah and also rejoice in the return to the Land of Israel as dreamt by generations past, and is remembered each Passover at the Seder table.

Passover allows us to discern the value of diversity through our own reasoning capabilities so that we are able to comprehend what freedom is. We also understand freedom a little more each year because freedom is just not breaking the yoke of servitude. There is freedom of thought and expression enabling us to become intellects for a moral encounter with all that society considers ennobling. There is freedom of knowledge, allowing us to create sparks which in turn create fires, which then causes the warmth of that knowledge to be part of our growing experience.

Each year something New becomes part of my participation in the telling of the story that has held the imagination of all people through the centuries. Every time I read the Haggadah I learn something different because I feel as though I personally traveled that journey bringing us to this moment in time.

I watch families reunited. I watch children smile as they search for the Afikomen. I watch the faces of mothers and fathers glow as they sit together reliving the past year and the past history of our beginnings. I watch grandparents and great grandparents "kvell" because they see the generations continue because of their dedication and devotion.

This surely is a holiday of family because the whole family of Israel started a pilgrimage that gave them purpose and meaning and fulfillment.

Our community too has its legacies of encouragement and fortitude and bravery. We face challenges every day whether it is illness or the loss of a loved one. We share a common bond of caring and sharing that makes the journey we are on more bearable and enjoyable.

We will all gather at some table and marvel at our ability to survive another year. We will remember those no longer able to join with us but with a reverence and understanding that they are here in spirit because life continues and we are the testament to the continuation.

Join us at our annual second night Passover Seder, and together we will remember the past, and give thanks for the present, and pray for the future. That is the meaning of Passover and the insight into our purpose. I can think of no better way to salute a New Year than joining together.



Billionaire Sheldon Adelson Wants to End Anti-Semitism at American Colleges

Billionaire Sheldon Adelson is speaking about a cause that he says is important to him: fighting anti-Semitism and the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement on American college campuses.

Adelson and his wife hosted a private event in New York City on Monday for the World Values Network, a pro-Israel group led by Rabbi Shmuley Boteach. When an attendee asked the 82-year-old businessman which of his "big ideas" he is most excited about, Adelson brought up the issue of colleges and BDS—a movement aimed at building economic and political pressure on Israel to return to pre-1967 borders, recognize the rights of its Arab-Palestinian citizens and allow Palestinian refugees the right to return.

Adelson's initiative is called the Maccabee Task Force, namedafter the ancient Jewish army believed to have rescued the Jewish religion. "The Maccabees are the fighters and the saviors of ancient times. So we want modern-day Maccabees to fight against the BDS and anti-Semitism on campus. We're going through an eight-college-campus experiment to see what works to get rid of BDS and anti-Semitism," he said at the Monday event. "So at the end of this semester, I think we'll have some better ideas."

The media first reported that Adelson was confronting BDS and anti-Israel sentiment on college campuses last June, when he hosted the first Campus Maccabees Summit at Las Vegas's Venetian hotel, which he owns. Some 50 groups attended the summit, and around 20 donors each pledged at least \$1 million to the cause.

"Before we throw a ton of money at this problem, we want to make [a] modest investment to identify the most effective initiatives. Once we have a tried and tested strategy, we will fund this strategy at a much higher level."

Expanding on Adelson's comments about the eight-college "experiment," Brog says the ongoing pilot program entails "building a broad pro-Israel coalition from the major student activists and pro-Israel organizations on campus" and "empowering this coalition to pursue a series of events/efforts to promote Israel in general and defeat BDS in particular." He says the task force will announce the results of the pilot program after it ends and then determine "what works and what to fund."

He declined to name the eight schools involved, which he says could "subject our partners to attack."

"We in the Jewish community have been thus far ineffective at telling the truth about Israel," Boteach says. "These students don't have the information, and that's why things like Campus Maccabee are so important in responding so that we get the real information out.

The Anti-Defamation League has said that the number of reported anti-Israel and anti-Semitic campus incidents increased 38 percent between the 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 school years. The Board of Regents for the University of California system, where reports of anti-Semitic incidents have made headlines, plans to vote on the adoption of "Principles Against Intolerance" next week.

Adelson, whom Forbes lists at No. 22 on its list of world billionaires, has an estimated fortune of \$25.2 billion. He is a major benefactor to Israel-related causes; he said at the Monday event that he and his wife give up to \$50 million per year to Birthright Israel, which provides free trips to Israel for young Jewish people. In 2013, Birthright said Adelson and his wife had given it \$180 million over the years.
