### Message from Our Rabbi

### **December is a Time of Faith**

If it is December it must be the time of Hanukkah and Christmas. Each year interfaith couples agonize whether this a religious adventure or a commercial enterprise. There is a tugging at the heart strings because respect for one another's faith is the foundation of the commitment made as vows were said and families were joined. And each year articles are written about celebrations, identifications, to ensure that the spiritual aspect of the season is not a cause for concern.

Couples of different faiths discuss this with me as they prepare to fulfill their pledge to one another. Sometimes there is an anxiety that surfaces because of outside influences. It is a time of "light," whether it be the lights on the tree or the glow from the candles on the Menorah. After all it is also a time of darkness. The days are short. The nights are long. It is cold and the harshness of winter is fast approaching. Life withers; the life of trees and flowers and people. We sleep as does nature. It is the darkest time of the year.

The one brightness that illuminates our lives is the breath of love. We have searched for the mate that makes us whole. The greatest glory is in knowing we are one of One. This is the essence of love and is the thread that helps us learn from one another and respect one another, which in turn translates into tolerance for belief and faith. This is what this season is all about.

Hanukkah is a time of dedication (as the word implies) and Christmas is a time of renewal. They are synonymous because renewal gives us the opportunity to rededicate ourselves to each other and the celebrations of life. The light of the Hanukkah candles and the brightness of the star as described in the Christmas story enable us to use this beacon toward an understanding of each other.

We cannot recapture the past. But we can use it to ensure the future. Religious understanding leads to religious freedom and is the clarion call for all people throughout history. Every grasp at religious freedom has had as its foundation the spark from the season of lights. That part of history may be no more, but the flicker of its meaning is within us by what we do and who we are, and the appreciation of our individuality.

This time of the year is also a time of connection – to our beliefs – the togetherness-to building a viable relationship. The utterance of "I do" is the affirmation of the love and respect. It is the completion of oneness because love knows no religion but rather the faith in God, the faith in each other.

Yes, it is December and rather than agonizing, I encourage couples of different faiths to focus on relationships and dreams and visions of continuity. It isn't easy. There is anguish on the part of family and friends. But the path to a successful relationship is still respect. And it has been said that chains do not hold a marriage together.

# **Cantorial Notes - Hanukkah Inspiration**

Our Hanukkah hero Judah Maccabee led a small band of Jewish soldiers to win victory over the Greek Seleucid army. The Greeks had decimated the Temple and were forcing Jews to abandon religious ritual. Judah's army, known as The Maccabees, managed to save Jewish culture at a critical time-when Hellenism was literally taking over. What was the driving force behind their belief that they could actually defeat a very powerful Greek army?

Jews carry with them the inspirational promise from God that we are chosen to spread His word to the entire world. I believe that it is this promise that not only inspired the Maccabees then, but continues to inspire Israeli soldiers today. The knowledge that God is with you is invigorating. Judah Maccabee was empowered by his sense that he was fighting for the cause of Judaism itself and for God. Thus, it made no difference that their small rebel army was theoretically no match for the Greek fighting machine.

As we all know, the Maccabees were victorious and the Temple in Jerusalem was rededicated. There was only enough olive oil to keep the Temple menorah lit for one day, however, it miraculously burned for 8 days, just long enough to retrieve more oil. This Hanukkah miracle was additional inspiration for our people then as it is today. Let the miracle of the oil linger

with you as you light your Hanukkah menorah this year and remember that God is with you as you perform this task. May it also inspire us all to feel that we can, individually-and as a small group, make a difference in the world.





### **News from Israel**

Israeli Arab Priest Tells UNHRC to "End Witch Hunt" of Israel: Father Gabriel Naddaf says the Jewish State 'is the Only Place where Christians in the Middle East are Safe'

A Greek Orthodox priest from Israel defended the Jewish state before the UN Human Rights Council on Tuesday, arguing that it is the only country in the Middle East where Christians are not persecuted, and imploring the 47 member nations to "end your witch hunt of the only free country in the region."

"In the Middle East today, there is one country where Christianity is not only not persecuted, but affectionately granted freedom of expression, freedom of worship and security," Father Gabriel Naddaf said.

"It is Israel, the Jewish state. Israel is the only place where Christians in the Middle East are safe."

According to Naddaf, some 120,000 Christians have been killed each year in the Middle East for the last decade. "That means that every five minutes a Christian is killed because of his faith," he said. "Those who can escape persecution at the hands of Muslim extremists have fled. Those who remain, exist as second- if not third-class citizens to their Muslim rulers."

Naddaf, who heads the Greek Orthodox Church in Yafia near Nazareth, maintained it "is time the world woke up to the fact that those who want to destroy the Jewish state are signing the death warrant on the last free Christians in the Holy Land.


"Leaders of people, seekers of peace, end your witch hunt of the only free country in the region," he added.

Naddaf was brought to Geneva to testify on the plight of Christian minorities by The Face of Israel, a public diplomacy organization that's affiliated with the Foreign Ministry.

Naddaf has become a controversial figure in Israel since joining the Forum for Drafting the Christian Community in October 2012 and for openly calling on Israel Christians to serve in the IDF. His activities have drawn criticism from Arab MKs as well as threats against his family.

In December 2013, his son was assaulted and hospitalized because of his father's views.

Naddaf was asked by the Forum to serve as a spiritual guide, along with two other clerics. But the other two dropped out following a campaign of intimidation, leaving Naddaf alone at the helm.
