
I Important Message from Our SLJC Choir ■

Message from Our Rabbi

The Meaning of Tradition

Usually at this time of the year we start asking questions because of all the commotion regarding Christmas. It is a wonderful time of the year and, a

frightening time as well. There are doubts about who we are and how we fit into the rush and excitement that we witness taking place with our Christian neighbors. I, for one, am happy for them because of the message of the season, not the trappings and gift giving.

To me, the meaning is quite simple which makes it even more appealing. "Peace on Earth, good will toward men" – men, of course, used in the generic sense. How could anyone argue with such a concept? After all it has its roots in Judaism's understanding of relationships and attachments. It emanates from the Jewish gift to humanity of the concept of a Messianic wish and hope – a time when all will be well with the world and the lion will finally lie down with the lamb indicating the removal of hate and fright.

And yet, while we delivered this message as described in the Prophets, we still are a skeptical people reacting more to practical feelings rather than spiritual ones. Our Christian brothers and sisters have taken the belief to include a physical arrival while we look to a time when order will be created out of chaos. Both traditions are rooted in the belief and hope that humanity is capable of good and noble things

We look at this tradition in a more humorous way giving us the opportunity to rationalize the idea so that we can digest it. For example the story is told about a small Russian shtetl (community) where the city council decides to pay a poor Jew a ruble a week to sit at the town's entrance and be the first to greet the Messiah when he arrives. The man's brother comes to see him, and is puzzled why he took such a low paying job. "It's true," the poor man responds, "the pay is low. But it's a steady job."

We wait and yet we wonder and all too often we see misery and homelessness and poverty and wonder about our ever witnessing a time of tranquility and peace. And, yes, we laugh because it gives us the ability to hope without feeling so frustrated.

A Jew comes home from Synagogue and tells his wife: "They say the Messiah is coming any day, and will take us all to Israel." The wife becomes hysterical. "Oh no! It would be terrible. It took years till we could finally move into this neighborhood, and buy the house we wanted. Now we've spent a fortune fixing it up. I don't want the Messiah to take us away." "Okay, okay, don't worry," the husband says. "We survived Pharaoh; we survived all types of discrimination. With God's help, we'll survive the Messiah too!"

Woody Allen reacted to the prophesy about the lion and the lamb explaining that a man was visiting a zoo and is taken to the lion's cage. He witnesses there the literal fulfillment of Isaiah's prophesy – a lion and calf in a cage together. Amazed he calls over an attendant. : How long have you had a lion and calf in a cage together?" "Over a year already." "How do you do it?" "It's easy. Every morning we put in a new calf."

So here we are at this time, in this place, and the same thoughts run through our mind about a Messiah and the message it is intended to deliver. But then I look around and see people rushing to help people. I see people, some tired, some ill, still reaching out to help others who need the help more than they. I see volunteers serving food to those who are hungry or bringing groceries and medicines to the housebound. I see people raising funds for the needy among us. I see others collecting food for those less fortunate. I see all of this each and every day and I realize that the Messiah is among us – in each of us.

This is not a dream or a wish – but in the person of each of us who join together to reconnect to an idea, a feeling, and a moment of sacredness.

Those who believe in a physical Messiah can witness all the Messiahs at work. Those who believe in a Messianic era – well each generation brings the Messianic time a bit closer through the works of their hands. This is how God intended us to believe in the future by living in the present.

To our Christian friends – let us wish them a very Merry Christmas together with the hope that their dreams and aspirations will receive fulfillment and that the message of this season will give them renewed faith in each other and in God.

We, who celebrate Hanukkah – my wish is that the lights of the Menorah will continue to burn in each of us as we go from strength to strength in achieving the meaning of the Messianic promise and expectation of goodness and mercy, of kindness and redemption. This is what the Maccabees, over 2200 years ago in the midst of turmoil and despair taught us by taking destiny into their own hands thus giving us the opportunity to get closer to God through our own efforts of determination and fortitude.

May God bless all who seek to find God through their own commitment of love and caring. And may He find favor with us as we begin a new season of continuity.

Cantorial Notes - Rock of Ages

One song we sing every year at Hanukkah time is Rock of Ages (Maoz Tzur). It is one of those things we do without really thinking about what it means and why it is associated with the Hanukkah season. Last year at this time my article focused on the Maccabees and their miraculous victory over the Syrian army. We believe that this victory was only possible because God was at

our side. Rock of Ages is a song of praise that acknowledges God's hand in what would have otherwise been insurmountable odds against Antiochus' army. Other verses of this song (in its original form) reference the Jews overcoming Pharaoh, Nebuchadnezzar and Haman.

The modern English lyrics of the verse most commonly sung during Hanukkah are as follows:

Rock of Ages let our song praise thy saving power.

Thou amidst the raging foes, wast our sheltering tower.

Furiously they assailed us, but Thine arm availed us.

And Thy word broke their sword when our own strength failed us.

Interestingly though, the more direct translation from the Hebrew poem is

My refuge, my rock of salvation! 'Tis pleasant to sing your praises.

Let our house of prayer be restored. And there we will offer you our thanks.

When You will have slaughtered the barking foe.

Then we will celebrate with song and psalm the altar's dedication.

It is even clearer in this poetic reading why Maoz Tzur is sung during Hanukkah. It expresses the longing for rebuilding the destroyed temple and thanks to God for His action against the enemies of the Jewish people. As we light our menorah's during this Hanukkah season, let us all remember the miracle of the Maccabee's victory and try singing Maoz Tzur in our own homes. May this festival of lights remind us all how lucky we are to celebrate in our homes and synagogue in a country where Judaism has flourished.








Jewish War Veterans (JWV)



News from Israel

In a 2011 Greenberg Quinlan Rosner survey conducted for the Israel Project, Palestinians were asked whether it was morally right or wrong to deny that "Jews have a long history in Jerusalem going back thousands of years." Seventy-two percent said it was right. In parallel, 90% deemed it wrong to deny that Palestinian history in Jerusalem goes back thousands of years. In a 2015 survey by David Pollock of the Washington Institute for Near East Policy, 83% of Palestinians asserted — regarding the area from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea — that "this is Palestinian land and Jews have no rights to it"; only 12% agreed that "both Jews and Palestinians have rights to the land."

Most Palestinians also believe Israel wants to drive them out entirely, especially from the Temple Mount in Jerusalem, where the Al-Aqsa mosque and the Dome of the Rock stand. Since Israel captured this area in 1967, Muslims have been allowed to visit it and pray at its mosques regularly, while Jews are restricted in their visits, have no place for group worship and are forbidden from praying there. Last year, a few Israeli politicians proposed relaxing these restrictions, but Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu repeatedly declared the status quo would not change, and his government has acted accordingly.

Yet when the Palestinian Center for Policy and Survey Research, known as PSR, asked on four occasions about Israel's intentions, 20% of Palestinians said Israel would allow Jews to establish a synagogue next to Al-Aqsa mosque, and a stunning 51% declared that Israel would "destroy Al-Aqsa and Dome of the Rock mosques and build a synagogue in their place."

The combination, as Palestinians see it, of a lack of a Jewish claim to the land with Israel's imagined, diabolical plans to dispossess the Arabs provides fertile ground for justifying radical actions. This helps explain Palestinian rejection of the pejorative "terrorism" to describe Arab attacks on Israelis.

In a December 2001 poll, 98% labeled as terrorism Baruch Goldstein's killing of 29 Palestinians in Hebron in 1994, but only 15% applied that term to Palestinian suicide bombings that killed 21 Israelis at a Tel Aviv nightclub in 2001. This attitude carries over to attacks on Westerners more generally, as 53% of Palestinians declined to call the 9/11 attacks terrorism. And, according to the Arab Barometer, a project of American and Middle Eastern universities and research centers, similar majorities refused to apply that term to the deadly attacks by Islamists a few years later in Madrid and London.

Palestinians' readiness to justify attacks on civilians also emerges from surveys of Muslim countries by the Pew Research Center. In six polls during the last decade, an average of 59% of Palestinians backed the view that "suicide bombing and other forms of violence against civilian targets are justified in order to defend Islam from its enemies" — making them the pacesetters on that question in every survey.

Since the Jerusalem Media and Communications Center began asking Palestinians in 2001, "How do you feel toward suicide-bombing operations against Israeli civilians?" support has exceeded opposition by an average of 20 points. In a December 2014 PSR poll that prefigured the recent attacks, 78% expressed support for the "increase in Jerusalem and the rest of the West Bank in attempts to stab or run over Israelis."
