Message from Our Rabbi

Hanukkah – 2016

King Solomon, in his wisdom, taught that there is nothing new under the Sun. Benjamin Franklin went further by declaring that there are only two things that are constant – death and taxes. Both expressions are lessons in life. We may

think that there are things in life that are sure, but the reality is that generational continuance is the only constant, because without it everything we know would cease to be. So much for the examples offered by Solomon and Benjamin Franklin.

The glue that keeps life meaningful is the knowledge that when we are a memory, the next episode of perseverance will occur. This has been, and continues to be the design of creation. There was a beginning, but there is no end.

We do have a part in guaranteeing the future. All is not left in the hands of some mysterious force – the one we refer to as God. Our lives, and how we live them, play an active role in the original intent of creation. Traditions begin to take shape, and from these traditions develop customs and humanities connection. Society becomes the grouping of these concepts until we finally arrive at a mode of conduct and adherence.

Hanukkah is, and was, designed to teach these important aspects of attempting to understand our place. It started with love – the love of our Creator, and the love of all who are important in our lives. If memory is the glue for life's meaning, then love is the cement that forms the foundation of the journey begun with our first breath.

Our pilgrimage encompasses compassion and strength. As we travel, we learn about awareness – the informed values enhanced by faith. Faith may seem like an abstract, but if we really think about it we should realize that without this faith there is no hope.

This year, all these thoughts will come together as we not only celebrate a 2300-year-old tradition, but also commemorate a life taken too soon as we dedicate the congregation's new Hanukkah Menorah, donated by friends and family of the late Jack Dante.

Memory is the one significant ingredient in Eternal Life. Each person that traveled with us and is no more represents the continuity that reinforces the constant belief of generational continuance. Remembering Jack Dante should serve to remind us of all who have gone before us. Hopefully, as we dedicate this new addition to our congregation's ritual valuables, we will pause for a moment and remember our past as we celebrate our future. There is no better way to hallow a holiday dedicated to the future.

Cantorial Notes: The Blessing of Hanukkah

As we all know, there are special blessings for lighting the candles on the menorah and they are sung to a very special melody reserved for Hanukkah. I thought the majority of you who don't speak Hebrew would appreciate seeing the translation. The first blessing is translated as follows:

"Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, Who sanctified us with His commandments and commanded us to kindle **the Hanukkah lights**."

The last part of the blessing in bold is the only portion that differs from the blessing we say over Shabbat candles which ends in "shel Shabbat." Here we are acknowledging the commandment to light the

menorah. The second verse is translated as:

"Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, Who performed wondrous miracles for our ancestors, in those days, at this moment." This blessing helps us recall the miracles of Hanukkah (the Maccabee victory and the miracle of the oil). The third blessing is sung only on the first night of celebration (the Shehechianu) and is translated as follows:

"Blessed are You, Lord our God, King of the universe, Who has kept us in life, sustained us, and brought us to this moment."

We express our gratefulness to God for allowing us to enjoy this special moment, milestone or celebration in our lives.

As we near the celebration of the miracles of Hanukkah, let us also thank God for our beautiful community, friends and family. I wish you a beautiful Hanukkah filled with light and joy!




