Cantorial Notes-September 2016

The Music of Selichot

As we reconvene our formal Friday night services in September, we will be celebrating Selichot, the time of reflection leading up to the High Holy Days. There are several common melodies that help us commemorate Selichot. In our congregation, we have typically included the Al Cheit, Ashamnu and Avinu Malkeinu.

The Ashamnu (the short list) and Al Cheit (the long list) are confessionals. We pronounce/chant our sins as a congregation. This helps give us the



sense of not only our responsibility for one-another, but is also helping to lift these confessions to God's ears by multiplying our voices on the melody. When we sing ai..ai...ai, we are crying together for the sins we have committed to one another and against God. We want God to hear that we are sincere in our repentance.

Avinu Malkeinu, Our Father-Our King, hear our prayers. We sing to God, and ask that he look favorably upon us and inscribe us in The Book of Life. We ask God to hear our prayers to end famine, war and oppression. Toward the end we ask God to treat us with charity and loving-kindness and finally for redemption.

It is my hope that you will come away from our Selichot service with the sense of having opened up The Book of Life and welcomed in the Holy Season. These melodies are meant to help prepare us for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Let us all come together as a community to sing these traditional prayers and look forward to a new year refreshed and with new promise.



Op Ed: Israeli Contributions to the World

World's Longest Glass-Bottom Bridge Was Designed by Israeli Architect

China opened the world's highest and longest glass-bottomed bridge last weekend, designed by Israeli architect Haim Dotan. The bridge is 6 meters (20 feet) wide, 430 meters (1,410 feet) long, and hangs 300 meters (1,000 feet) high above a ravine in Zhangjiajie National Park in Hunan province. It is fitted with 99 huge three-layer glass panes through which visitors can glimpse the drop below.

To prove the bridge is entirely safe, in June Chinese officials staged an event in which a glass pane was repeatedly bashed with sledgehammers, then driven over with a car full of passengers. The glass held.

Israeli Aid for Louisiana flood and Canada Fire Victims

Israeli non-governmental organization <u>IsraAID</u> is sending eight highly trained volunteers to Louisiana this weekend to help flood victims return to their homes, salvage personal belongings and get back into a normal routine as soon as possible.

"We watched the storm developing in the last few days and with the help of our local partners we got a snapshot of the enormous damage and the great need for assistance and rehabilitation," said delegation head Naama Gorodischer, Global Programs Director for IsraAID.

At least 13 people were killed and more than 60,000 houses were damaged in the Louisiana floods, which could be the largest natural disaster in the United States since Hurricane Sandy in 2012. IsraAID helped US communities after Sandy and five other calamities including Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and last year's wildfires in Washington State.

In May, the group sent its first-ever team to Canada, after wildfires in Fort McMurray in the province of Alberta forced the evacuation of 90,000 people from their homes.

Seven Israeli volunteers joined veterans and aid workers from Canada and the United States in clearing debris and sifting through the toxic ashes, assisting local authorities and offering professional psychosocial support.

Even now, as thousands of Fort McMurray families are still not allowed back into their homes, the Israeli volunteers are continuing to provide specialized psychosocial training to several local agencies that give direct services to those most affected by the fire.
