

Summertime is just around the corner. Daytime temperatures will be in the 100's and nighttime brings some relief, but not much. Happily, there are many things to keep us busy and continue to enjoy

the life we live, heat and all. The pools are busy, the movie houses are filled, and the shopping malls also offer some relief (although not necessarily from our purses or wallets). Now that COVID has been officially declared over — well, out we go to venture to the cooler spots.

Our congregation also offers some refreshment. And don't underestimate the benefit of refreshing our souls. Summertime is no time to retreat from the adventures these opportunities afford which can continue to give us fulfillment. For example:

- 1. There is a Friday evening Shabbat service in June. It is scheduled for June 14 at 7:00pm, and we will celebrate Shavuot. I hope you will find it a wonderful worship experience.
- 2. There are two Friday (Twilight) services in July and August. They are scheduled for July 12 and August 9. Both services begin at 5:30 pm and end at 6:15 pm, giving you ample time to fulfill your dinner obligations or make plans accordingly.

Now we are also making plans for a great fall homecoming. There are many people planning an exciting High Holiday experience. Here is the schedule for you to consider:

- 1. Selichot services Friday evening, September 13 at 7 pm. This year, as is our custom, we will include the Selichot service with our regular Shabbat service. In addition, we will commemorate the anniversary of the September 11th attack on our country. This is a most fitting way to begin our High Holiday experience. I know we will leave knowing that we Americans share a common destiny and heritage.
- 2. Rosh Hashanah services Wednesday evening, October 2 at 7 pm and Thursday morning, October 3 at 10 am.

- 3. Kever Avot services Sunday morning, October 6 at 10:30 am at The Valley of The Sun Cemetery. Honoring our deceased loved ones is an annual tradition in our congregation. The entire Jewish community is invited as well. We will also bury any and/all unneeded religious objects and books as we did last year. This will follow the service. The Cantor and I will also, as in the past, be available for anyone who wishes us to say a special prayer at the grave of a relative or friend.
- 4. Kol Nidrei services Friday evening, October 11 at 7 pm.
- 5. Yom Kippur services Saturday morning, October 12 at 10 am. At 2 pm we will hold our annual "Talk with the Rabbi," followed by Mincha (Afternoon) services at 3 pm, Yizkor at 4 pm, and Neilah at 5 pm. Break fast will be offered following Yom Kippur services.

In the meantime — have a great summer. Think of us here in charge of the heat and please, send some cool air from wherever you are.



Shavuot - 5784 June 12, 2024

Shavuot is an interesting holiday commemorating our understanding of life, happiness and commitment. When we received the Ten Commandments at Mt. Sinai, a new chapter in the history of mankind developed that included responsibilities to our fellow man, to ourselves and to God, who blessed us with the wisdom that has become the standard used by generations. The Commandments have been and remain a message for all people in helping us realize that life is of no value unless it contains discipline and connection - connection to each other and to God.

There are many customs associated with this forgotten holiday. One is that we traditionally eat dairy instead of meat products as a reminder that life is precious all life.

We also read from the Book of Ruth, which describes the essence of loyalty and devotion to family and faith. Ruth utters the most famous of the declarations found in the Bible as she remarks to her mother-in-law. Naomi, "Whither thou goest, I will go. Thy people will be my people, they God my God." Ruth marries Boaz and from that union King David was given to us to begin the process of solidifying the Israelites into one nation.

Another custom, in traditional circles, is remaining awake all night in the study of Torah. Finally, it is one of the four times a year we recite the Yizkor prayers in memory of loved ones who are no longer part of our everyday experiences. I remember the all-night sessions during my religious education. Contests would be held to determine who among the students could recite chapter and verse from the Torah or the Mishnah or the Talmud from memory. It was a time of seriousness and fun.

To this very day, I open my editions of the Talmud and Bible on Shavuot Eve to pay tribute to those times as well as to the words written thousands of years ago that ring true today. The gifts of knowledge are precious and sometimes we take them for granted – all forms of knowledge.

Unfortunately, after the fun of Shavuot, our attention turns to the tragedies that have befallen our people from the ancient past to the present as we observe



Tisha B'Av. This date of the 9th of Av caused our people much agony and pain. The two Temples were destroyed, one by the Syrian Greeks and the other by the Romans. From the second destruction we never recovered and suffered many calamities over the two thousand years.

And then, in modern history, the greatest miracle occurred with the return of the exiles and the rebirth of a people in their God given land. This time it is forever, and though we witness continued pain and turmoil for accepting the responsibility given to us by God, we will remain steadfast in our determination to NEVER AGAIN witness the attempt at the destruction of the Jewish People. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur offer us an opportunity to pause and reflect. Tisha B'Av offers us the opportunity to remain strong of heart and hope. 24

Let's get involved! How you ask? Here are some ways:




I look forward to seeing you at the June service and of course in September when we all return from our summer hiatus.

SOMETHING YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

IEWISH HEADS OF STATE By Murray Siegel

There are two countries which have a Jewish president and a lewish prime minister. One obviously is Israel, but you might not know that the second one is Ukraine. Most know that the Ukrainian president is Volodymyr Zelenskyy, who is Jewish. Their prime minster is Denys Shmyhal, who is also a Jew. The prime minister heads Ukraine's executive branch of government, the Cabinet of Ministers, and signs decrees passed by the Cabinet.

Shmyhal grew up in Lviv and received his college degree in accounting there. His wife, Kateryna Shmyhal, is also from Lviv, where she previously owned the Kamyanetsky Bakery and the NextBike bicycle rental company. They have two daughters.

Prior to World War I, the city of Lviv was called Lemburg, located in the Eastern part of Austria-Hungary, a major center of Jewish culture. Today, there is an active Orthodox congregation in Lviv, the Golden Rose Synagogue, which was opened in 1582.

As an aside, my mother's parents grew up in Lemburg and eloped to New York when their families prohibited their marriage. After 1918, Lemburg became Lvov, a city in Poland, and following World War II, Lvov became Lviv in Ukraine.

JWV JOINS FORCES WITH ARC TO SUPPORT THE TROOPS

Jewish War Veterans Copper State Post 619 (JWV) supports many of Arizona's veteran's nonprofit organizations throughout the year with funds raised primarily from poppy drives at Fry's Supermarkets and Mesa Market Place twice a year.

JWV recently presented a check for \$1000 to Support the Troops (STT), a nonprofit club set up within the Ahwatukee Recreation Center (ARC), which supports active-duty military in remote areas outside the country. These funds helped with STT expenses and the post also collected thousands of items from JWV members at their meetings.

Support the Troops spring and fall events are chaired by Barbara Le Chaix. Volunteers gather at ARC to pack 150 identical boxes. Total shipping cost for each event is around \$7,000.

JWV Senior Vice Commander, Dan Tilsner fondly recalls being a young Airman stationed at a tiny remote base in Turkey during the Gulf War. "We didn't have any comforts of home; so we were thrilled to get them. These boxes were a small token from America that said, 'we know you are there, and we care'. It was a big deal for us."

Monetary donations come from ARC's 35 clubs, American Legion Post 64, and JWV, which are used to buy supplies. Anyone wishing to contribute to future shipments may contact Barb Le Chaix by email at bjlechaix@gmail.com.

Boxes often include high top socks, a tshirt, small packs of wipes, toothbrushes and small toothpastes, decks of playing cards, a paperback book, puzzle booklets, small packs of beef jerky, snacks, gum, snack bars, pretzels, etc. To fill the spaces between the items, individually wrapped hard candy is spread throughout the box.

Military contacts are supplied by Luke Air Force Base and AZ Army National Guard. "Letters and special messages

with pictures are received after every shipment. The letters are touching and let us know we want to continue this project as long as needed." adds Support the Troops Chair, Barbara Le Chaix.

JWV Post Commander Robert Kaplan explained, "This is the type of support JWV is all about, and we will continue to partner with STT and other veteran nonprofits that help active-duty military and veterans."

JWV Post 619, which meets monthly from September to June, boasts members who represent a wide range of religious affiliations and participate in philanthropic activities to help veterans of all faiths. 
